SPRING SELF ASSESSMENT CHECKLIST

Why do self assessments?

Exterior wood and other surfaces suffer a lot of stress with constant exposure to the elements and temperature changes. Spring and Fall temperatures are perfectly suited to review deterioration and remedy any curb appeal and maintenance issues.

MAILBOXES Deint or replace mailbox (black point)
Paint or replace mailbox (black paint)
Paint or replace mailbox post (grey paint) Re-secure falling/leaning mailbox post or horizontal arm
Ne-secure raining/learning mailbox post of nonzonial arm
GARAGE DOORS
Paint and/or repair garage door and/or deteriorating panels*
HOUSE EXTERIOR
Exterior House: Paint/refresh weathered home exterior *
Siding: Repair/replace damaged siding, paint raw siding boards to match house Trim: Repair or replace if damaged
Trim: Refresh peeling/weathered paint around windows, doors, garage, etc. Repair loose siding, gutters and/or roof shingles
Remove excessive debris from gutters
Paint and/or repair decorative and other fascia *
Straighten and/or refresh entrance railings
LANDSCAPING
Remove excessive weeds from lawns
Remove weeds from flower beds, driveway cracks, and/or street curb
New mulch/pine needles and clear leaf accumulation
Trim trees, shrubs and/or bushes
Replace dead shrubs, bushes, trees and/or plants (weather/drought permitting)
MISCELLANEOUS
Remove debris from property (including items stored outside of garage)
Fences: Repair/replace damaged sections; refresh paint/stain condition *
Refuse Containers: Store completely out of sight of road
